

# Te Kura Reo o Raukawa

15-19 o Āperira 2024

Te Kura Reo o Raukawa is a transformative week-long marae based cultural program primarily focused on te reo Māori development led by the iwi. Its primary objective is to enhance the knowledge, confidence, and proficiency of Raukawa te reo Māori speakers and learners.

Participants engage in a supportive learning environment tailored to address specific reo progression needs and confidence levels. The curriculum spans from basic language skills to advanced fluency, all facilitated by esteemed local te reo Māori and tikanga tutors.

Designed specifically for Raukawa uri, the program prioritises uri members and secondly individuals residing within the Raukawa tribal area who share a strong affiliation with the iwi and its te reo Māori aspirations. If spaces remain available, registrations from others will be considered.

## Registration Fees

\$150 per person – Uri o Raukawa (Not receiving professional development assistance)

\$450 per person – Uri & non-uri receiving professional development assistance

\$50 Hōtaka Tamariki – Children between the ages of 5-12 yrs

Uri o Raukawa will receive first preference as places are limited on this programme up until the 28<sup>th</sup> March 2024. From this date all spaces will be filled with paid registrations from non-uri members according to date of registration and payment.

There are 100 adult student places and 20 places for the Hōtaka Tamariki (5–12 years) available to those who have completed paid registrations. Once this number has been attained registrations will close.

### Student Demographic

- Raukawa uri members living as ahikā (within the rohe) or from throughout the motu and abroad who are Māori language speakers with basic to advanced level fluency who wish to improve their confidence, understanding & use of the language in multiple settings.
- Basic level learners will enter Te Pūtake o te Reo Class.
- Community members living within the rohe who have a strong affiliation with the iwi and its reo Māori aspirations.

### Programme Details

- Students will be placed into groups based on their reo fluency from basic through to advanced level fluency. Students of previous kura reo will be expected to return to the same group and from there be re-assessed if required. New students to the kaupapa should indicate their level of fluency on registration to help kaiako better place them.
- Each group will attend classes over the duration of the programme.
- Students will receive a student workbook containing the programme & the content that will be taught in each class.

## Te Hōtaka Tamariki | Children's Programme (5-12 yrs old) 20 tamariki

- The Hōtaka Tamariki will run each day from 9am to 5pm. **Parents will be responsible for taking care of your children throughout the week outside of these hours including kai time supervision.**
- Your tamariki will be supported by kaiako with resources and a programme tailored to their learning and playtime needs.
- Tamariki will not be allowed to run freely throughout the day or sit outside of the Hōtaka Tamariki Programme unsupervised.
- The Hōtaka Tamariki will be run on site. Please ensure to take your tamariki to the kaiako each morning and receive them on return.

## Babies or infants (0-4 yrs old)

- You are welcome to bring your baby or infants if you're comfortable looking after them during classes. Please ensure thought is given to the kaiako and classmates learning space.
- There are no additional costs for these tamariki.

### **Dietary Allergies or Requirements**

- There is a section allocated on the online registration form to describe any reasonable dietary requirements or food allergies you may have.
- Our caterers will prepare additional dishes to cater for vegetarian or vegan participants.
- If allergies are indicated the caterers will attempt to substitute those ingredients or they will clearly indicate all dishes containing the ingredients of concern.
- If you have a peanut allergy, please let us know its severity on registration.
- Please ensure you supervise your tamariki during kai times if they have allergies.

### **What to Bring**

- Classroom style learning supplies: Pens, pencils, and highlighters.
- Laptops or tablets are optional – bring your own 4-way plugs & extension cords.
- Māori dictionaries, the following are recommended.
  - Williams, Dictionary of the Māori Language
  - Bruce Biggs, The Complete English Māori Dictionary
- Warm and adequate clothing, blankets, towels, and toiletries suited for a week-long marae stay.
- Mattresses, sheets, pillows, and pillow slips will be provided (you are welcome to bring your own)
